Biography 1

- Born October 26, 1947 in Chicago
- Graduated 1969 from Wellesley College, BA in political science
- Graduated 1973 from Yale Law School, Juris Doctor
- Married Bill Clinton in Little Rock, 1975
- Taught Law, Partner with Rose Law, and cofounded Arkansas Advocates for Children and Families



Biography 2

- First Lady of Arkansas in January 1979
- Daughter Chelsea born 1980
- First Lady in 1993, own office in White House
- Task Force on National Health Care Reform
- UN Fourth World Conference on Women, 1995
- Elected to the U.S. Senate, 2000
- Ran for president, 2008 -> Secretary of State



Issues – Budget & Economy

- Tax relief for working families, college costs, profit sharing businesses
- Invest in infrastructure and scientific research
- Equal pay, minimum pay
- Closing tax loopholes
- End to “quarterly capitalism”
- Accountability on Wall Street



Issues – Education

- Chaired the Arkansas Educational Standards Commission
- Preschool access, Early Head Start and Early Head Start–Child Care
- High-quality education a priority
- Invest in supporting teachers



Issues – Health Care

- “Affordable health care is a basic human right”
- Affordable Care Act
- Lower out-of-pocket costs, prescription drugs
- Rural health clinics
- Planned Parenthood



Issues – Immigration

- Comprehensive immigration reform
- Path to citizenship
- DREAMers
- Humane, common-sense enforcement



Issues – Jobs

- Proposed an economic plan to raise incomes
- Employee Free Choice Act
- Collective bargaining rights
- Raising the federal minimum wage to 12\$
- Investments in infrastructure
- Rewarding high-quality training and apprenticeships
- Enhance—not privatize—Social Security



Issues – Tax Reform

- Tax credit for businesses of \$1,500 per apprentice
- Tax relief for working families, college costs, profit sharing businesses
- Reform tax code to reward investment in USA
